Dismissal and Aftercare Reminders

Students in pre-school through grade 4 are dismissed at 2:45 PM each day and grades 5 through 8 at 2:50 PM. **Students that have not been picked up after school by 3:15 PM will be sent to Aftercare and charged for the service.** On early dismissal day students that have not been picked up by 12:50 PM will also be sent to Aftercare and charged for the service. Families of Pre-school students attending ½ days that have not picked up by lunchtime will also be charged for the time the student spends in extended care.

If you would like to enroll for the Aftercare Program please call the school office and request registration materials and they can be sent home with your child.
