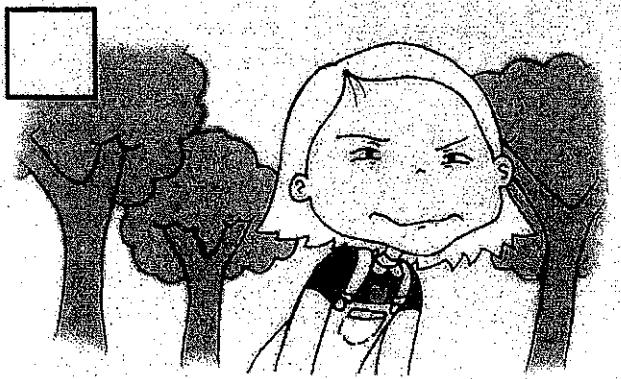
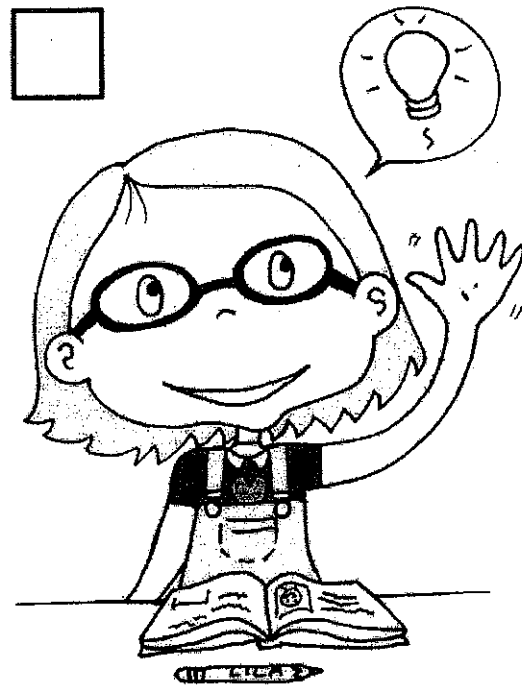
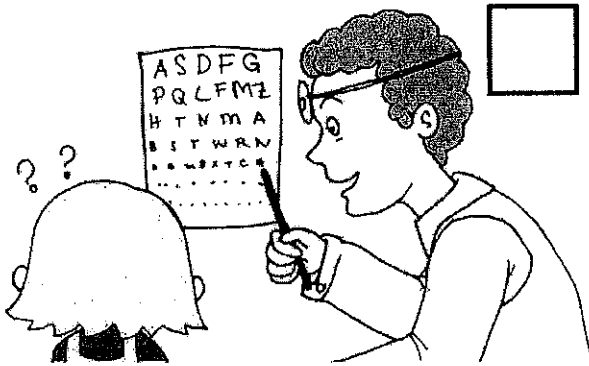
Read the story below, then number the illustrations in the order in which they took place in the story.

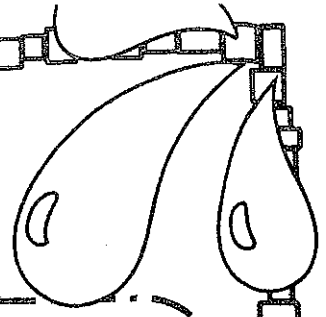

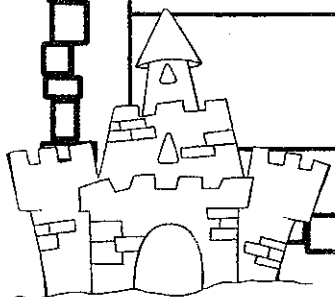
